

# Ryle will recreate Hogwarts

**SAs plan event that will allow students to experience fantasy**

Students wishing to enter the magical world of Harry Potter can head to Platform Nine and Three-quarters or just walk to the Ryle Hall lounge.

Tomorrow night the lounge will be transformed into Hogwarts, complete with a forbidden forest, for a Residence Life community program.

Sophomore Rachel Storjohann, a student adviser in Ryle, said she started planning the Harry Potter program as soon as she was hired in August to be an SA.

"I really wanted to immerse people in the culture of Harry Potter ... in all the magic and just make it really really special for people," Storjohann said.

The all-night program, which will run from 8:30 p.m. to 8:30 a.m., will be full of as much of Harry Potter's world as possible without the use of magic.

Students first will be sorted into houses by the sorting hat, Storjohann said. Participants will draw neckties from the hat that have the colors of their house and positions. Unfortunately, not everyone will be sorted into the highly desired house of Gryffindor. Some will have to join the much-despised house of Slytherin.

In addition to joining houses, participants also will have a job, either on the Quidditch team, a prefect or head boy or girl, she said.

"Everybody will have something small they contribute to the program," Storjohann said.

After the sorting is complete, Dumbledore will welcome everyone to Hogwarts and the magical feast will commence, Storjohann said.

All the famous magical treats found in Harry Potter will be served, from butterbeer to

chocolate frogs.

"It would be pretty cool if our plates just filled themselves," Storjohann said.

The first three movies will be shown throughout the night, she said, along with other activities.

Everyone who ever has dreamed of playing Quidditch will have their chance, despite the lack of flying brooms.

Storjohann said she has found a way to play the game without people being slammed with bludgers and getting hurt.

The winning team will be the first to snatch the snitch.

"[The snitch] will be thrown into the game randomly, ... so the seeker won't know when it will be thrown in or by whom," Storjohann said.

All of the houses will play each other in the Quidditch tournament, and the winning house will be awarded the Quidditch Cup.

Senior Kerri Gallen, community coordinator in Ryle, said the staff really has gone all-out planning the program.


"A lot of us are closet Harry Potter fans, so it is a chance where we all can experience the dorky side of us."

She said Residence Life emphasizes six core values, which are demonstrated in different programs. The values include community, diversity, lifelong learning, health and wellness, service and personal development, she said.

Community programs like Harry Potter are typically the most widely attended, she said. All-night programs are not very common because they take so much planning, Gallen said.

She said it is fun getting lost in the Harry Potter books and going back to being a kid.

"It gives us a chance to get away from the typical stigma of a college student," Gallen said. "People think that once you are in college you are supposed to be reading 'War and Peace' or Thoreau."

The Harry Potter program is open to the whole student body, and Gallen said she is looking forward to it.

"It is giving [students] an opportunity to step outside of Truman," she said. "I'm hoping people will feel like they are coming into this wizardry world when they come to the program."

Sophomore Danielle Tolson said it would be interesting to watch the Harry Potter program even if she doesn't participate.

Tolson said she is more of a fan of the books than the movie.

"I like Harry Potter because, as many books as there are in the world, it manages to take you someplace you have never been before," Tolson said.

Storjohann said she received the books from England her freshman year of high school.

"I started [reading the books] before there was the Harry Potter craze," Storjohann said.

Although the magical world of Harry Potter might appear very distant from Truman, she said there are aspects students can relate to.

Students who live in the residence halls are divided into houses like they are in Harry Potter, she said. Also, residence halls compete for the House Cup during Truman Week, Storjohann said, similar to the competition that exists in Harry Potter.

Storjohann said she is excited to share her love of Harry Potter with everyone at the program.

"One of the best parts of being an SA is being able to share your enthusiasm for everything," she said.

The fourth Harry Potter movie, "Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire," is released tomorrow. Storjohann said she plans on seeing the movie on Saturday after recovering for a while following the all-night program.
