Lindenwood defeats 'Dogs

Wrestling team loses for the eighth-straight time against the Lions

The wrestling team won just two matches and forfeited two others in a dual-meet loss at Lindenwood University last night.

The Lions took advantage of a patchy Truman lineup to win 37-6. It was the largest win by Lindenwood and its eighth-straight against Truman.

Freshmen Ryan Banning and Andy Bader picked up the only wins for Truman. Senior Loyde Braidlow lost the closest match of the day, 9-7, in the heavyweight division.

The Bulldogs finish the season 2-9 in dual meets, one match better than the 2008-09 record. Both wins were at home. Lindenwood currently is No. 4 in NAIA, and they have been a national champion in the past.

Before the meet the banged-up Bulldogs knew they would be giving up points against Lindenwood.

"Up and down their lineup, they're a really, really strong team, so it'll be a good match experience for the people who do get to go," senior Dean Schultz said Tuesday.

Before the match against Lindenwood the 'Dogs competed in the Missouri Valley College Open Saturday and defeated Newman

23-19 in a home dual Friday.

At the MVC Open, the Bulldogs placed sophomore Alex Maus at 141 and senior Loyde Braidlow at heavyweight.

Maus made it to the championship of the wrestlebacks and lost 6-4. He gave up two late points after twisting his ankle, and head coach Dave Schutter said he will be out for one to two weeks.

"Alex has turned the corner here — he's wrestling a lot better this second semester and towards the end of the season here," Schutter said.

Braidlow also excelled with his third top-four finish in a row at an open. After winning his first three matches by either mercy rule or pin, Braidlow lost in the final 1-0 because of an escape. Braidlow's opponent Dom Bradley has been ranked as high as No. 4 in Div. I, and he was the junior world champion last summer.

Sophomore Chad Kurvoski and senior Andrew Bader were the only two other Bulldogs to record at least two wins, and the team did not have any wrestlers compete at 125 or 133.

Against Newman, Truman took advantage of forfeits at 125 and heavyweight for the four-point win. Bader, senior Dean Schultz and freshman Zach Hayes earned wins for the Bulldogs.

The match would have ended with a Truman loss, but senior Kazuyuki Hastimoto lost his redshirt to pick up the victory at 125.

The oft-injured 'Dogs had lost their last eight dual meets.

"It's nice, not just for myself, but for the team to get a strong dual win when we've been kind of banged up and not had our best performances as of late," Bader said.

Bader won his match 3-1 to start a strong defensive performance throughout the weekend. In four matches, Bader gave up six points and a pin against No. 1 seed Joe Cornejo at the MVC Open.

"One thing I'm getting better at is my defense on my legs," Bader said. "Early on in the season if someone got my leg they were almost guaranteed to take me down, whereas this past week I've been able to spin out of a little more."

Schultz had the 'Dogs most lopsided victory of the day, 14-1 against Jacob Weaver at 174.

Schultz said he gave up the one point because he was so focused on going for the pin.

"I was able to hit pretty much anything I wanted, which was nice," Schultz said. "I was really working for the pin, I just kind of gave up getting the tech-fall because I spent so much time trying to get the pin."

The 'Dogs are still banged up heading into the MIAA Duals this Sunday in Hays. Schutter said freshman Colton Schmitz still has four weeks left to recover from an MCL injury, and he doesn't know "if any of our guys are truly healthy."

The 'Dogs were swept in the MIAA Duals last season.

Women's swimming: Tippin out with torn intercostals

Sophomore women's swimmer Krista Tippin has torn her intercostals, the muscles in the ribcage, and is questionable for nationals.

Tippin said she started feeling pain about a month ago during the winter training trip but continued to swim before it was diagnosed. She said she thinks the muscles were gradually torn, but she does not know exactly how it happened. The intercostals help with breathing, and Tippin said it takes six weeks with no physical activity for the pain to go away.

Tippin sat out the dual against Drury University on Jan. 23 and will not swim in the conference meet, which started Wednesday and goes through Saturday. She said it is "still up in the air" whether she will compete at nationals.

She has qualified for nationals through the 200-yard medley relay and also has B-cut times in the 100- and 200-yard backstroke. She finished top-30 at nationals in those two events in 2009.

If Tippin cannot swim at nationals, freshman Stacey Wymer can replace her in the 200-yard medley relay because Wymer has an A cut in the 200-yard individual medley. Even if Wymer did not have an A cut, any swimmer qualified through the relay could still swim at nationals.

Truman could have qualified another 200-medley relay at the conference meet yesterday through an A cut. However, the relay team of Wymer, sophomore Jessica Jenkot and juniors Tanya Sylvester and Carina Pautz finished slightly more than a second off the mark. Pautz is the only one of the four that is tapered for the meet.

Men's swimming: McCall prepares for final conference

Swimming head coach Mark Gole said the presence and leadership of senior Andrew McCall have been instrumental in preparation and keeping the team focused on individual goals.

"Sometimes there's eight workouts in six lanes so having Andrew, being a member of the program for this is his fourth year, he knows what's going on, ... and I can trust that Andrew's going to tell them exactly what they're doing how [assistant coach Tim Sandfort and I] would say it," Gole said.

McCall is nearing the end of his final season and attempting to continue the legacy he has been part of during the last four years. In the 2008-09 season, the men's team finished 16th in the nation and has finished in the top 20 each of the past 14 seasons.

Men's basketball: Henderson named all-Academic

Junior guard Alex Henderson was named to the ESPN the Magazine/College Sports Information Directors of America all-Academic team. He received a first-team all-district nomination. Henderson is second on the team in scoring and leads the team in assists and minutes.

Henderson is the fifth Bulldog to earn a first-team all-district honor and the first since 2004. Henderson was the only MIAA player selected for the award. He will be entered on the national Academic All-American ballot.

Women's track: Dell'Orco breaks 5,000-meter record

For the second time in two weeks, the women's distance team had a runner break a long-standing Bulldog record.

Sophomore distance runner Dani Dell'Orco won the 5,000-meter run with a time of 17:11.74. The time is not only an NCAA provisional mark, but it also breaks a 10-year-old record by more than 20 seconds. The last competitor to hold the record was Beth Lubbering with a time of 17:32.18 in 2000.

Another top competitor for the women's distance team was senior Fiona Williams. Williams also made a provisional mark in the mile run and placed fourth with a time of 5:03.46. Dell'Orco placed fifth in the mile with a time of 5:04.27, only 0.27 seconds away from a second provisional mark. Williams broke an 18-year-old school record Jan. 30 in the 1,000-meter run.
