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coming from Nigeria.
"Any of this Nigerian stuff goes through Western Union," he said.

Justin Jones, Kirksville Police Department Detective, said Waters was incarcerated in Southern Missouri for other financial scams soon after he began the investigation.

He said he doesn't think the supposed victim, Tom Hawkins, is a real person and the whole scenario likely is set up with no transactions having taken place. Hawkins listed the Kirksville address and the disconnected local phone number as his contact information. Jones said the business owner located at the address doesn't know Hawkins.

"Until I have Tom Hawkins standing in front of me writing a statement saying, 'Hey this is what happened to me,' I don't have a victim," Jones said. "Because I'm not going to have somebody as a victim when they're sending me some kind of correspondence saying they are in [Wales] when I know the information is coming from Nigeria."

He said it's possible the scam artist or artists are attempting to be reimbursed through law enforcement, even though there is no legislation in place for the government to reimburse financial crime victims.

"I don't know what the bottom line of the scam is," Jones said. "I don't see what anybody has to gain from any of it."

King said the case likely will be submitted to the FBI and grouped with similar Internet scams for further investigation.

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going to form the coalition.
Paino said this group of faculty, staff and sole student representative is not supposed to be a representational group, but rather a group of people who have certain skill sets and knowledge bases he hopes will aid in creating a successful University vision.

He said the breadth of the members of this coalition hope-

fully will extend the conversation throughout the campus, even though the sole student representative is Nely.

"It was an exciting moment when President Paino asked me," Nely said. "I thought he was going to ask me for a recommendation for who would be a great student advocate."

Nely said he wants to gain as many student opinions as possible, which is why he is creating a student coalition (see story page 2) that will be mirroring Paino's guiding coalition.

"I want student input, so I hope that students know that if they have something

they want that committee to know, they can contact me," Nely said.

Paino said he asked Nely to sit on the committee to act as a knowledgeable conduit for the student body.

"I wouldn't want to get any student involved, as much as I appreciate their service, if the service would interrupt their prime reason for being here," Paino said.

He said he's confident this coalition consists of people who are trustworthy, have the proper skill sets, have credibility on campus and have effective communicating skills.

Jon Gering, dean of science and mathematics, said being asked to serve on this coalition will be a challenge, but he's glad to be involved.

"Challenges of this nature involve a lot of things, some of which can be exciting and some scary," Gering said.

Paino said future meeting dates will be set today at the first discussion, but he would ideally would like to see the group meet weekly.

"I feel a sense of urgency, so I want to push this process as much as possible," he said. "But I'm not going to do anything that may harm the process."
