### Pickler Memorial Library adds archaeology collection to Special Collections

The Special Collection section of Pickler Memorial Library now includes the personal papers of noted archaeologist Louis Binford, who died in April at the age of 79. He is remembered for changing the way archaeologists think about evidence by emphasizing the long-term forces that drive change, according to an obituary in "The Guardian." Binford's widow Amber Johnson, an anthropology professor and chair of the Department of Society and Environment, donated the collection. It includes manuscript files, photographs, maps and artifacts.

### Juniors and seniors eligible to participate in Elie Wiesel Prize in Ethics essay contest

Submissions are being accepted for the Elie Wiesel Prize in Ethics essay contest, which is sponsored by the Elie Wiesel Foundation for Humanity. The first place prize is \$5,000, second is \$2,500, third is \$1,500 and two honorable mentions receive \$500.

"Whatever the answer to essential questions of society and individual human beings may be, education is surely its major component," Elie Wiesel wrote in a letter on the foundation's website. "But what would education be without its ethical dimension?" Full-time juniors and seniors are eligible to submit an essay by 3 p.m. Dec. 5.

### 33 years ago

Students moved out of motel rooms into University housing  
1978

After living in the Oak Tree Inn for two months, 11 students moved out of their motel rooms and into University housing. An increase in enrollment and on-campus renewable rates forced the students off-campus. It cost the University \$6 a day per student to rent space at the motel.

### 22 years ago

1989

An 83-year-old man held science professor Albert Copely and 20 Truman students at gunpoint while the group was on a spelunking trip south of Salem, Mo. While on state-owned property, the man claimed he owned the land and accused them of trespassing. Copely and his students wrestled the gun away from the man, who ultimately was arrested.
