Men win MIAA opener

Taking advantage of a poor shooting percentage from the free-throw line and beyond the arc by the Missouri Western State University Griffons last night, the Truman State men's basketball team won its conference opener 71-69 to improve to 3-3 for the season and 1-0 in MIAA

The 'Dogs and Griffons traded leads repeatedly the entire game, with the Bulldogs holding a narrow 36-34 lead at halftime. The men were able to hang on to their two-point lead at the end of the game with help from junior forward, and team scoring leader, Mike Carlson who scored 11 points during the second half to give him 19 for the game. Carlson also led the team in rebounds with nine and blocks with two.

An offensive boost came from senior guard Tom Norton, who originally was planning on medically redshirting this season, but instead came off the bench for the Bulldogs against Missouri Western. Norton hit two crucial three-pointers during the second half and finished with 11 points during the game.


Junior guard Isaac Gardner shot 3-10 from beyond the arc and hit three of four free throws to total 12 points.

The Bulldogs' defense kept Missouri Western to a .452 field goal percentage, and a .250 percentage from the three-point line. The Griffons finished 7-13 from the free-throw line.

The win comes as a confidence boost for the Bulldogs, who have had troubles in close games dating back to last season.

The team returns to Kirksville to face the Missouri Southern State University Lions at 3 p.m. Saturday in Pershing Arena. The Lions come into the game at 5-3 with no conference wins.

'Dogs take first loss

The women's basketball team hit the road last night for its first conference matchup of the year against the Missouri Western State University Griffons in St. Joseph, Mo.

The 'Dogs came into the game riding a six-game winning streak and were looking to keep their undefeated season alive, but those hopes were dashed by the Griffons as Truman State lost 64-71 to bring its record to 5-1 on the season. A week prior, the Bulldogs had defeated the Griffons 67-65 in the Lincoln University Tournament, however the win did not count toward their conference record.

Offensively, the Bulldogs shot .535 from the floor and .462 from the three-point line, relying on the offensive production of senior forward Jennifer Conway and junior guard Amy Briggs. Conway finished with a team-high 14 points, shooting 7-11 from the court while Briggs ended the game with 13 points and a team-high four assists.

Missouri Western finished with a .538 field-goal percentage, shooting 50 percent from the three-point line. The Bulldogs have averaged a .390 field goal percentage against them in the team's six games and allowed an average of 54.4 points a game, good enough for fifth in the MIAA.

On defense, Conway led the team in blocks with two while junior forward Bianca Szafarowicz led the team in rebounds, finishing with six, four of which were defensive.

Following the loss, the Bulldogs will have an opportunity to improve their conference record one more time before the New Year arrives. The 'Dogs return to action at 1 p.m. Saturday in Pershing Arena against the Missouri Southern State University Lions, who currently are 6-1 for the season.

The team will travel to the California Baptist Tournament in Riverside, Calif. following the game against the Lions. The Bulldogs next home game after the holiday season is at 1:30 p.m. on Dec. 31 against NAIA opponent Mount Mercy Uni-
