El Vaquero reopens in Kirksville

El Vaquero, a Mexican restaurant, is returning to Kirksville this spring. The restaurant was open during 2008 for about a year before being shut down by the Federal Bureau of Investigation because restaurant owner Neftali Lopez used false Social Security numbers for restaurant employees.

Barber case sent to Missouri Supreme Court for consideration of appeal

The appeal code for former Kirksville dentist Steve Barber might be heard by the Missouri Supreme Court. The case has been sent to the Missouri Supreme Court and is pending review.

Barber originally was convicted by the Adair County Circuit Court during June 2011 on two felony counts of tampering with a witness and sentenced to five years in prison for each count. He appealed the case to the Western District Court of Appeals, which sent the case back to the circuit court for a retrial. The state attorney general's office appealed the ruling and asked the appeals court to reconsider or send the case to the Supreme Court.

Barber was released on a \$5,000 bond and will remain free until the final decision of his appeal.

University works to begin implementing new Liberal Studies Program 1997

Faculty members began creating outcome statements, which are criteria for new or changing classes, as part of a plan to implement the new Liberal Studies Program. The plan also included a series of open forums and a presentation to the Undergraduate Council. Proposed changes included a minimum foreign language requirement and calculus, computer literacy and statistics requirements for all majors.

City makes plans for new recreation complex 1984

The City proposed a \$2.3 million outdoor park and recreation complex after receiving low marks for outdoor recreation facilities during a review by the National Parks and Recreation Association. The 80-acre facility would be located between U.S. 63 and Lincoln Road and was planned to be built during a seven-year period.
