Football suffers 24-35 loss to Washburn University

After allowing yards of total offense and four turnovers, the Truman State football team lost 24-35 to No. 19 Washburn University on Satur-

day in Topeka, Kan. On the offensive side of the ball, quarterback Conrad Schottel finished 18-44 for 175 yards and four interceptions a week after throwing for 273 yards and two touchdowns against the University of Nebraska-Kearney. The offense totaled 326 yards, with 151

rushing yards. Senior running back Will Mosquera led the team in rushing and receiving yards, totaling 46 yards on the ground and 45 yards through the air. Sophomore running back Garrett White scored two touchdowns on the ground, with Schottel running one in as well.

Junior wide receiver Dallas Grier was kept to four catches and 43 yards despite being in the top five in the conference in receptions and receiving yards, and in the top ten in receiving touchdowns.

The game brought Truman's record to 8-4-1 overall and 5-1-1 in MIAA conference play.

Last Thursday, the Bulldogs hosted No. 17 Fort Hays State and finished on top 2-1.

The 'Dogs started fast, with a goal from Franta during the first minute of the game. Nearly three minutes later, Fort Hays came back with a goal to tie up the game 1-1. It was not until the 84th minute that Truman scored the final and deciding goal of the game, made by Tony Luedecke off of a penalty kick.

Truman was outshot by the Tigers 14-20 and Bulldog goalkeeper Garrone saw all 90 minutes tallying nine saves during the game.
