A.T. Still names dean of St. Louis dental clinic

A.T. Still University has named Dr. Kim Butler Perry as the dean of its dental clinic in St. Louis.

Perry will oversee parts of the clinic's day to day operations and work with students from A.T. Still's Missouri School of Dentistry and Oral Health.

Perry formerly was an associate professor of dentistry at Meharry Medical College School of Dentistry in Nashville, Tenn. She will assume her position April 21.

MSDOH began classes during October 2013 and currently has 42 students.

Local church applies to Kirksville Historic Preservation Register

Kirksville's Trinity Episcopal Church has applied to become a local historic landmark.

Trinity Episcopal, which is located at 124 N. Mulanix St., applied to join Kirksville's Historic Preservation Commission April 2. It is being considered alongside the Chicago-Burlington-Quincy Railroad Depot.

Trinity Episcopal Church was built during 1917 and is on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places.

Two former Northeast Missouri State University students were charged with arson in connection with a fire that destroyed social fraternity Sigma Phi Epsilon's storage barn. Former students Brian Byrd and Bryan Jones, who were members of social fraternity Sigma Tau Gamma, later were released on \$5,000 bail each. Zel Eaton, former Assistant Dean of Students, said the University would not take action against the students until the outcome of the trial was determined. Second-degree arson carries a maximum penalty of \$5,000 and seven years imprisonment.

Board of Governors approves athletic fee

2007

Truman State's Board of Governors approved a University-wide athletic fee April 13, 2009. Students approved the fee, which cost \$50 per student and benefits the athletic department during Student Senate elections before the BOG put the fee into effect. Out of 2,332 students that voted, 54.5 percent were in favor of enacting the fee. The fee, as it was proposed, provides funding for repairs to athletic venues throughout campus.
