Group gives AIDS perspective

One campus group will attempt to combat the stigma about HIV by inviting students to walk a mile in someone else's shoes.

Truman State's chapter of the CARE for AIDS organization will host an "Experience Event" from 5-7 p.m. Feb. 21 in the Baptist Student Union. CFA Events Director Sammi Ackerman said admission is free, and the event will feature a traditional Kenyan meal including a vegetarian option — a makeshift CARE for AIDS center for participants to walk through and a talk from Justin Miller, cofounder of U.S. CARE for AIDS.

CARE for AIDS is a Kenya-based organization that provides holistic health care to people with HIV, Ackerman said. This includes health services, counseling, business classes, career resources, religious opportunities and family programs. She said the role of university chapters is to fundraise for the centers, which require roughly \$20 per month to treat a family of four.

Kirsten Maakestad, Executive Director for the Truman CFA chapter, said the event is geared toward giving participants a chance to see the realities of living with HIV. Each person will be issued a card with their name, life story and status — HIV positive or negative — that will determine the nature of their "experience" throughout the event.


Students then will see firsthand a representation of what patients face during the nine-month programs offered by CARE for AIDS centers, Maakestad said.

All "Experience Event" participants will have an opportunity to respond after the event, to receive more information or become involved directly, Maakestad said. She said it's important those attending understand that coming to the event brings no expectation of commitment to the organization.

Truman's CARE for AIDS chapter hosts several events each year to raise funds and HIV awareness, with the goal of aiding the Kenyan centers and eradicating the negative stigma associated with AIDS.

"We're just trying to help students see how they're in a powerful position, even as college students, to truly make lifechanging differences in people's lives in Kenya who have AIDS," Maakestad said.

The Truman chapter raised nearly \$25,000 of support last year, she said. According to the organization's website, the combined total for all CARE for AIDS University chapters was more than \$160,000 during 2012, amounting to roughly 20 percent of that year's total revenue.
