### Truman welcomes bluegrass artist for Lyceum Series

Rhonda Vincent, a five-time Grammy-nominated bluegrass artist, will perform for the second evening of the Kohlenberg Lyceum Series 7:30 p.m. Nov. 14 in Baldwin Hall Auditorium.

Vincent has produced 15 albums since 1988, and has collaborated with artists such as Dolly Parton, Faith Hill and Willie Nelson.

### Award-winning filmmaker to visit Truman campus

Fred Kuwornu, award-winning African-Italian filmmaker, will visit Truman State's campus Nov. 13-14 and present two of his documentary films.

Kuwornu's first screening will be for "Inside Buffalo," a film about the segregated African-American Army combat unit that fought in Italy during World War II. The film will be shown at 7 p.m. Nov. 13 in the Baldwin Hall Little Theater.

The following day, there will be a screening of Kuwornu's film "18 lus Soli" at 7 p.m. in Violette Hall 1000. The film examines the status of the one million children of immigrants raised in Italy who are denied citizenship. There will be an opportunity to meet the director in the Violette Atrium at 6 p.m. before the film, with refreshments provided.
