Kirkville residents charged in Wal-Mart theft

Two Kirkville residents were charged for the alleged theft of more than \$700 in air rifles, ammunition and accessories from the Kirkville Wal-Mart last week.

Kirkville residents Jeffrey Allan Wachter and Dustin Glaspie were charged with class C felonies. These charges were because of Wachter and Glaspie's alleged theft of four air rifles, one airgun pistol, one pistol holder, one box of CO2 cartridges and two packages of airgun pellets.

The suspects allegedly attempted to steal the items by parking a pick-up truck next to the lawn and garden center at the storefront. They allegedly tried to slide items from inside the store under the fence to the outside.
