Organizations and departments can print and complete forms, but they must be submitted after the room lottery begins Nov. 3. The Reservation Office will not accept any early requests.

Confirmations will be mailed to campus offices and delivered to student organizations' mailboxes in the lower level of the SUB during the last week of fall classes, but will not be emailed.

Any submissions the Reservation Office receives after Nov. 6 will be processed on a first-come, first-serve basis once earlier lottery requests have been processed.

More information will be mailed to offices and departments beginning Oct. 27. Packets also will be available in student organization mailboxes located in the Center for Student Involvement Complex.
