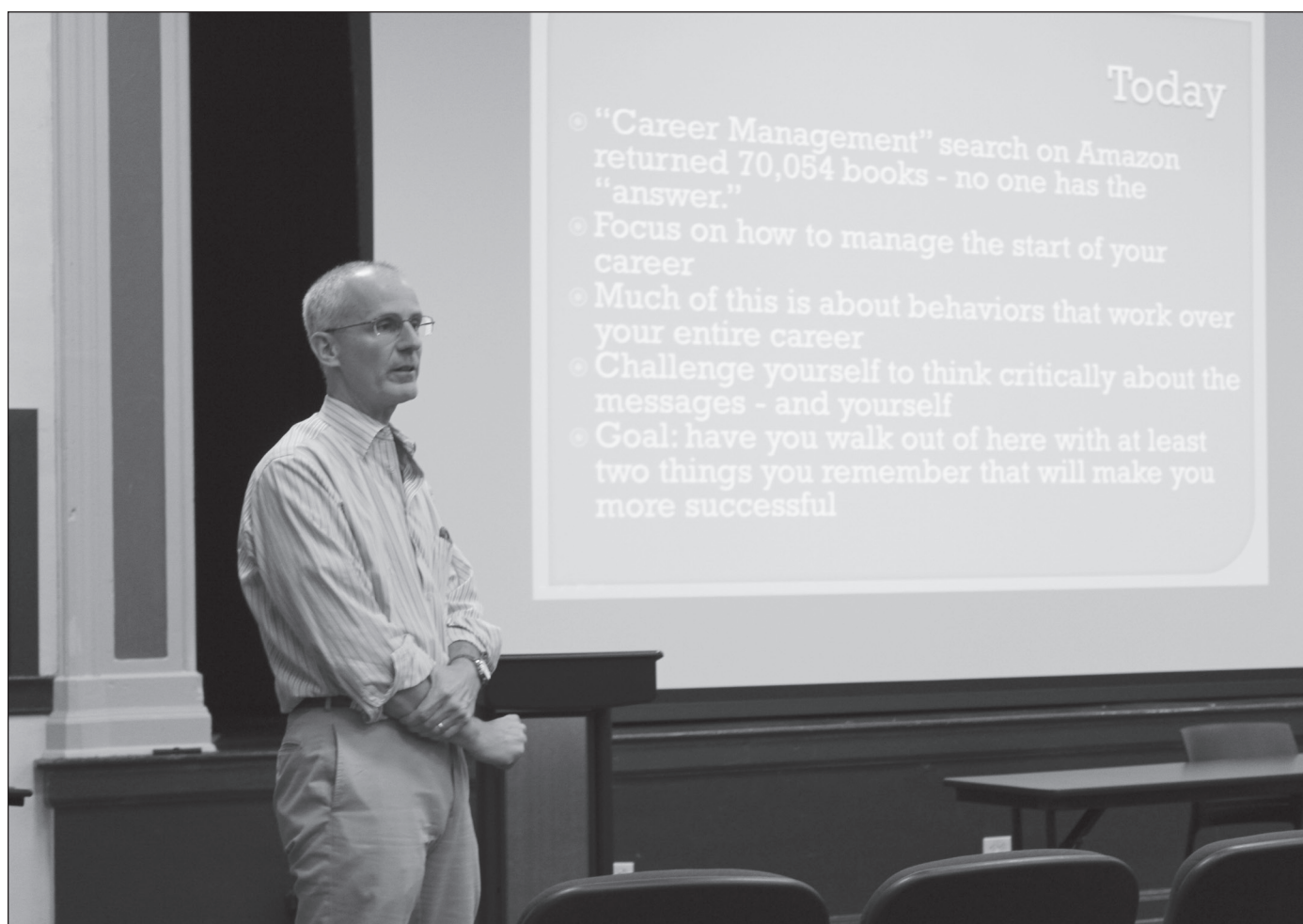


Fraternity hosts professional development guest speaker
