American Cancer Society updates breast cancer recommendations

The American Cancer Society changed its recommendations for breast cancer screenings.

The American Cancer Society now recommends women ages 45-54 receive yearly mammograms. Mammograms every other year are recommended for healthy women ages 55 and older who expect to live at least another 10 years. The previous recommendation was for women ages 40 or older to receive yearly mammograms.

The age change is a reaction to controversy surrounding women younger than 45 receiving mammograms. Research shows being tested at a younger age can lead to false positives and unnecessary procedures.

The society no longer recommends women of any age receive clinical breast exams, a process in which a doctor or nurse feels for lumps in breast tissue.
